1. Haematology-Medical Oncology

Programme description: Inpatient treatments for leukemia lymphoma, myeloma, solids neoplasie, bone marrow auto-transplantation (JACIE accreditation)

Outpatients treatments for lymphoma myeloma solids neoplasie, bone marrow auto-transplantation and bone marrow allo-transplantation follow up

Programme description: Inpatient and outpatient treatments for solids neoplasie. Accredited to "European Union of Medical Specialists (UEMS) - Section and Board of Nuclear Medicine (EBMN)"

3. Research (clinical and nursing research unit)

Duration: 4 weeks - 3 months

Observership or Residency: Observership

Language requirements: Italian and English

Programme description: The Clinical Research Unit in Oncology, and in particular the new drug group, offers patients the chance to receive therapies with experimental drugs, that is, still under study. The Unit also offers the opportunity to participate in international studies conducted to evaluate the benefit that innovative treatments offer compared to standard ones in certain types of cancer.
