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## About Cancer Prevention Europe

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[Cancer Prevention Europe](#) (CPE) is a collaborative network of European research institutions and organisations active in cancer prevention, created in 2018 as a result of the European Commission's EurocanPlus platform, to develop excellent cancer prevention research to be translated into effective guidelines and policies. EONS is an Affiliate Member of CPE.

The CPE Learning Centre is an initiative to provide certified and non-certified learning modules among other materials (e.g. webinars) to build capacity and support knowledge transfer on cancer prevention from leading experts in the field.

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## CPE Learning programme and EONS campaign

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The first CPE multilingual online programme on primary and secondary prevention of cancer is targeted to **health promoter and advocates of cancer prevention, including nurses and other health professionals**. It provides the perfect tool to help develop activities for the PrEvCan campaign

The programme consists of **2 sets of free, self-paced, e-learning modules**:

**1. The [European Code Against Cancer \(ECAC\)](#), 4<sup>th</sup> edition:**

This **certified** set of 13 free self-paced, online learning modules includes 12 modules on each of the recommendations within the ECAC and one module on the methodology underlying the 4<sup>th</sup> edition of the ECAC.

**2. Latest evidence on cancer prevention, myths, and controversies:**

This complementary set of 12 e-learning modules presents the latest evidence and tackles myths and controversies related to the topics addressed by the European Code Against Cancer, 4<sup>th</sup> edition.

An **evaluation of the learning** is available after completing the 13 self-learning modules on the [European Code Against Cancer, 4<sup>th</sup> edition](#). The evaluation includes:

- A survey
- A quiz
- Complete survey + quiz to get **a certificate of completion issued by both CPE and the International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC)**.

The CPE learning programme is a grant asset for your organization to prepare and contribute to the PrEvCan campaign. We encourage to enrol in the CPE learning before or during the preparations of your campaign.

As the campaign tackles one recommendation per month of the European Code Against Cancer, 4<sup>th</sup> edition, our modules will be key for the development of your activities throughout. Each module is around 10 min, very interactive, allows you to test your knowledge and gives you access to all the references of the covered information. They provide an understanding of the scientific evidence behind the development of each recommendation, as well as the authoritative sources of reference to be able to raise awareness on the European Code Against cancer, 4<sup>th</sup> edition.
