It allowed us to collect valuable data demonstrating our VR game's effectiveness in pediatric oncology care. However, the impact of the EONS grant extends beyond the financial aspect. Additionally, winning this grant strongly incentivized my academic self-confidence and enthusiasm for the field.

Through this grant, I have had the privilege of maintaining a strong and collaborative relationship with EONS, a leading organization in the field of oncology nursing.
